


CHANGI POINT - A HIDDEN CULTURAL AND NATURAL HERITAGE

SITE CHARACTERISTIC - A HIDDEN SPACE WITH RICH HERITAGE RESOURCES

Changi Point is located on the northern coastline of Singapore near Changi Airport. Yet as an important gateway, the site is hidden in the city corner, while its rich cultural and natural heritages are also gradually forgotten, and some of them are facing the risk of submergence from Sea Level Rise in the future. 

Habitats Distribution




